Rules

1. Ages 13 to 17 years
2. No Exhibitor Fee
3. All food products must be placed on a stiff cardboard type plate and placed in a plastic bag with a twist tie. Staple your exhibitor tag at the bottom of the bag
4. Trophy for the highest points from Class 200 and Class 201
5. Coordinator's Choice from Class 200 and Class 201. A \$10.00 prize will be awarded

Judging will be done on the following: Look, Creativity and Taste

Prizes: 1st - \$5.00, 2nd- \$3.00, 3rd - \$2.00

1. Brownie Pizza – Cook a brownie mix in a round pan, making it become a pizza shape and decorate it, making it look like pizza toppings (i.e.: jellybeans, gummy worms, etc.)

2. Open Class - Muffins - 3 (any size)

6. Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies – No Nuts
 - a) Contest is open to youth up to the age of 15 years as of December 31, 2017
 - b) 8 cookies displayed on a firm disposable plate, covered with plastic bag, closed with a twist tie
 - c) Cookies must be no larger than 3" (6.75cm) in diameter and no smaller than 2" (5cm) in diameter
 - d) The entry must be tagged with exhibitor's name, address and District
 - e) Cookies will be judged according to the Homecraft Judging Standards established by the OAAS

f) The winner from our Fair will be eligible to enter the District competition. The winning cookies from District will go to the OAAS Convention 2018
